Triin: Yes, and there's a new playground behind the house.

Krista: We can play there between lessons.

Triin: I like the **breaks**. Then we can run and play.

Krista: And we can have **lunch** in the **canteen**.



Triin: This year our lessons are in the morning. The first lesson **starts** at half past eight.

Krista: I **hope** the lessons are over by 2 o'clock. Then we can do sports in the **afternoon**.

Triin: I want to study hard this year.

Krista: So do I. I only want to **get** good **marks!**

Greg: Yes, I do. The pupils and teachers here are **really friendly**.

Gary: I like it too. My favourite **subject** is science. What's your favourite subject?

Greg: I like PE **best**. Do you do sports at school too?

Gary: Oh, yes! We run, jump and play games. On rainy days we're in the **gym**.

Greg: How **often** do you have PE?

Gary: We have 2 lessons a week – on Tuesdays and Fridays.

Greg: Cool!



Gary: Where do you live?

Greg: I live near the **bus station**.

Gary: So do I! Let's walk home together!

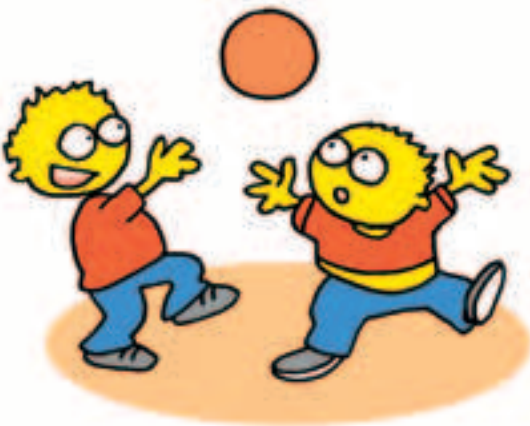
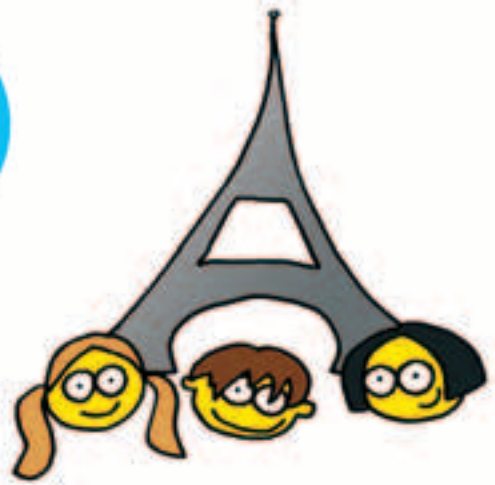

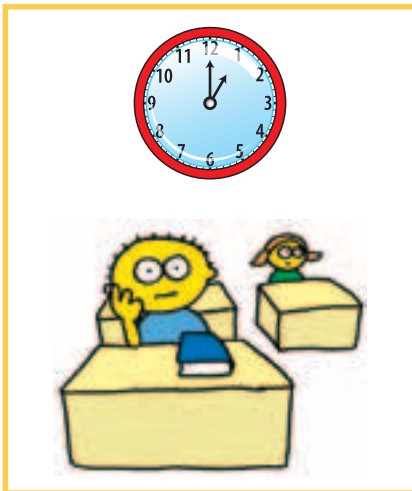
